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What is Mythology?


- A myth is a sacred narrative (or story) explaining how the world and humankind assumed their present form
- Mythology can include an traditional story that involves elements of spirituality, mysticism, legend

- Once you understand the myths of a culture, you can understand the people of that culture much better
- For example, the Christian Creation story involves:
 - Curiosity
 - Disobedience
 - Law and order
 - Male vs. Female

How Do Myths Spread

- Myths are stories, and stories get told
- These stories are passed down from generation to general by oral tradition (or word of mouth)
- Before the technological age, stories carried great weight. You couldn't google your way out of a story that was difficult to understand

What Do Myths Do?

- Myths define social customs and beliefs
- Myths are allegories, similar to parables in the Bible
- Myths explain natural phenomena
- Myths explain psychological phenomenon such as love or anger
- Myths contain archetypes that reveal what all humans are like




Types of Myths

- **Creation myths** explain where the world and its creatures came from



- **Cosmogeny myths** describe the way the world, the heavens, the sea, and the underworld are put together, and how the sun and moon travel around them

Creation of the Titans and the gods



- **Origin of humanity** myths help explain where humans came from, often the pet creation of a deity playing in the mud
- **Introduction of disease and death** myths often describe that first humans living in a paradise that is marred when someone introduces unhappiness.



- **Afterlife myths** help people explain where the human soul goes after the body dies



- **End of the world myths** suggest how the world will eventually end



The Mythological Players

- Deities
 - The supernatural entities that hold power over the world and the people in it. Often called gods and goddesses



- Antigods
 - The non-benevolent deities; negative beings who live and walk the earth with humans. Might include devils, dragons, demons, monsters, or giants.



 - Human characters who perform amazing feats of daring, strength, or cleverness. They're usually male, and their defining characteristics are evident from childhood
